## TOP SIX THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THIS SKIT

1. **Expression is KEY.** Since there are no words in this skit, it is up to your group to be as expressive as possible. Though this skit is ***not designed to be funny***, it is designed to be theatrical and meaningful. It will be necessary to be sure that facial expressions are intentional and that anytime the students are on stage, they are using their body language and expression to (overly) indicate what is going on so that all those in the audience can clearly understand the message of the skit.
2. **Timing is everything!** The time and lyric notations indicated on the script will be helpful tools/key words for the youth to know when things are happening throughout the skit.
3. If you and your youth group have a conversation about another bullying scenario that you would like to incorporate in place of one of the scenes indicated on the skit...go for it. Just be sure to stay within the time frame indicated on the script for each scene's start/end/switch. The scenes created by CHWC came as a result of asking local teens about the things they deal with and currently see happening in their schools and social circles. Anything that is altered will need to be appropriate subject matter and the Director at your Workcamp will have the final say regarding any changes that are made to the official script.
4. Be sure to use the CHWC Audio Link provided at [heartworkcamp.com/skit](http://heartworkcamp.com/skit). This link has been created specifically for this skit and is different than anything you will find online.

6. We hope your group will learn the 7-sequence choreography from the movie for the last scene! Once you review the resources on the skit website, you will find the "mirroring dance instructional video" very helpful for your group to learn the dance. Remember: the whole theme of the movie (and this skit!) is about embracing what makes us unique and being true to ourselves. You do not have to be perfect actors/dancers to make this skit powerful.
