

Teens to participate in Catholic HEART Workcamp

PLATTSBURGH — Catholic HEART Workcamp, a weeklong service camp for teenagers, will be returning to Plattsburgh June 24 through 30.

Some 275 teens from Minnesota, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New Jersey and New York will be attending the camp. They will be housed in Seton Catholic Central School and will spend their week of service reaching out to those in need in the Plattsburgh area.

The teens will work on projects such as painting, cleaning, landscaping and general repairs at area homes and churches, as well as interact with residents of Meadowbrook Healthcare and children at the Ted K. Center.

HEART Workcamp began in 1993 in Orlando, Fla., with 100 campers and has grown to include more than 13,000 campers in 50 cities across the country, as well as several international camps.

"The goal of HEART Workcamp is to provide teens with an opportunity to serve others and to live out and grow in their faith," a media release said.
